

Challenges on MIXP v1.0



Operational

- Technical team are reluctant to make changes because of no governance model structure
- No community alignment on how the exchange should run and the importance of the IX
- No Redundancy
- No access after regular business hours



Future Growth

- Hosted in a government data center, it is very difficult to have international carriers or providers to come and host their networks here.
- MIXP not playing fully its complete role in involvement of the community



Addressing the Challenges observed on MIXP v1.0



- 1. Providing a new platform for a second Exchange Point which will address the challenges of the MIXP.
- 2. A separate entity to the current MIXP with its own governance model.
- 3. Re-negotiating with the existing service providers to peer at the new Exchange point.



Addressing the Challenges observed on MIXP v1.0

Community driven Extension to existing MIXP MIXP v2.0

- 1. We thought it would be better to have the whole community and operators included in this journey to create a better Exchange point for Mauritius in which every one identifies themselves and have a sense of belonging to.
- 2. Create as much awareness as possible on the importance of the Exchange point so that the whole community unites together for better and bigger efficiencies.


